RESOLUTION NO. 68-18

RESOLUTION APPROVING DISSOLUTION OF THE BOLINAS HARBOR DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Marin County Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 9741 proposing the dissolution of the Bolinas Harbor District in the County of Marin was heretofore filed with the Executive Officer of this Commission and said Executive Officer has examined said resolution and found it to be mandatory; and

WHEREAS, at the times and in the form and manner provided by law, said Executive Officer has given notice of a public hearing by this Commission upon said resolution; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing by this Commission was held upon the date and at the time and place specified in said notice of public hearing and in the order continuing such hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin does hereby resolve, determine and order as follows:

1. Resolution No. 9741 of the Marin County Board of Supervisors applying for dissolution of the Bolinas Harbor District is approved subject to the following conditions:

(a) The liability up to the maximum amount specified in Exhibit A for payment of principal, interest or any other amount which shall become due on account of all or any part of contracts or obligations of the Bolinas Harbor District, as specified in Exhibit A, shall be transferred to the County of Marin and authority shall be vested in the County of Marin to levy taxes for such payment, provided, however, that the liquid assets of the Bolinas Harbor District shall first be utilized in the discharge of such indebtedness to the extent possible. Provided, further, that in the event of any indebtedness incurred, other than that enumerated above, such indebtedness will be an obligation of the property owners of Bolinas Harbor District, in accordance with Section 56508 of the Government Code.

(b) The State of California, through legislation and the State Lands Commission, shall agree to grant to the County of Marin, effective on the date of dissolution of the Bolinas Harbor District, all rights and interests in the State tidelands held by the Bolinas Harbor District.

(c) The effective date of such dissolution shall be either:
(1) the effective date of legislation required in condition (b) above
or (2) June 30, 1969; whichever date is later.


2. The Executive Officer is hereby authorized to mail certified copies of this resolution in a manner provided in Section 56272 of the Government Code.



BOLINAS HARBOR DISTRICT

BEGINNING at a point on the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean formed by its intersection with the line between Sections 25 and 36, T.2N., R.9W., MDB&M as said line appears by superposition of the lines of Civil Division of the General Land Office upon the County of Marin; thence east along the south line of Section 25 aforesaid; thence east along the south line of Section 30 of T.2N., R.8W., MDB&M; thence northerly along the east line of Section 30 aforesaid; thence east along the south line of Section 20 of said T.2N., R.8W., to its intersection with the west line of Five Brooks Subdivision No. 1 as shown on that certain map filed in the office of the County Recorder for Marin County in Book 4 of Maps at page 32; thence easterly southerly and northerly along the southerly line of said Five Brooks Subdivision No. 1 to its intersection with the line common to the lands of Ella M. Denman and Sam Smoot (formerly the lands of Charles L. Blake) being also the point at which the old County road crosses the creek of Olema Lake; thence southeasterly and northeasterly along said common boundary to the most northerly corner of Smoot aforesaid; thence southeasterly along the northeasterly line of the lands of Smoot; the lands of Nellie Deevy, the 1590 acre tract now or formerly belonging to Walter A. McMaster, the Mary B. Wilkins et al 1390 acre tract; the 200 acre tract of Raymond O. Flood et ux (formerly belonging to Anginette HasBrouck) and the R. A. Carey 19 acre tract, to the northerly corner of the Fremont Morse 780.15 acre tract; thence southeasterly along the northeasterly line of Rancho Las Baulines to its intersection with the northwesterly line of Ranch 8; thence northeasterly along said line to the most northerly corner of Ranch 8; thence southerly along the easterly lines of Ranches 8, Y, Z and U to the southeast corner of Ranch U, all said Ranches as shown on Map No. 3 of Tamalpais Land and Water Company; thence westerly and northwesterly along the westerly lines of Ranches U, I, 2, and 4 of said Map, said westerly lines being along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; thence continuing northwesterly along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean to the point of beginning.
