RESOLUTION NO. 69-24

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FORMATION OF THE
MARIN COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 69-185, a resolution of application for formation of a fire protection district, has been filed with the Executive Officer; and

WHEREAS, at the times and in the form and manner provided by law, said Executive Officer has given notice of public hearing by this Commission upon said resolution; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing by this Commission was held upon the date and at the time and place specified in said notice of public hearing,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin does hereby resolve, determine, and order as follows:

1. Resolution 69-185 of the Marin County Board of Supervisors applying for formation of the Marin County Fire Protection District is approved subject to terms and conditions hereinafter specified.
2. The boundaries of the proposed district as set forth in the resolution of application are approved.
3. The effective date for the formation of the Marin County Fire Protection District shall be July 1, 1970.
4. The formation of the Marin County Fire Protection District shall be subject to the following conditions.
 - A. The district shall enter into an agreement with the County of Marin effective July 1, 1970 to provide grass, timber, and watershed land fire protection services identical with those which the County of Marin is obligated to provide under its contract with the California State Division of Forestry.

B. All employees of the Marin County Fire Department shall be transferred to the employment of the Marin County Fire Protection District effective July 1, 1970 with the same rights and benefits which they now enjoy in County employment.



RESOLUTION ABANDONING PROCEEDINGS FOR CREATION
OF A COUNTY-WIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, this Board has heretofore adopted Resolution No. 69-222, initiating proceedings for and setting a hearing on the question of a County-wide Fire Protection District pursuant to the Health and Safety Code and Government Code; and

WHEREAS, it now appears that the creation of such a district would be impractical at this time and that certain lands necessarily excluded from such proposed district are excluded by the provisions of the Health and Safety Code and Government Code;

STRUCTURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

Beginning in the Pacific Ocean at the southwestern corner of Sonoma County; thence southeasterly along the southern line of Sonoma County, to the mouth of Petaluma River; thence southeasterly to the common corner of Marin, Sonoma, Contra Costa, and Solano Counties in San Pablo Bay; thence southerly along the western boundary of Contra Costa County in the Bay of San Pablo, to the middle of the Straits of San Pablo; thence southerly in a direct line to Invincible Rock, in the Bay of San Francisco, near the entrance of the Straits of San Pablo; thence, in a direct line to the northwestern point of Red Rock; thence southerly to the extreme southerly point of Angel Island; thence southwesterly to the extreme end of Point-Cavallo at the low-water mark; thence on the line of low-water mark along the northern shore of the bay to Point Bonita, and three miles into the Pacific Ocean, to the northwestern corner of San Francisco County; thence northwesterly by ocean shore to the place of beginning.

Excepting and excluding therefrom the following incorporated areas and special districts as their boundaries exist as of June 15, 1969:
