RESOLUTION NO. 77-1

RESOLUTION MAKING DETERMINATIONS AND APPROVING THE ANNEXATION OF  
TERRITORY DESIGNATED AS REDWOOD BOULEVARD ANNEXATION (1976-11)  
TO SANITARY DISTRICT NO. 6

WHEREAS, a proposal for the annexation of certain territory to Sanitary District No. 6 in the County of Marin, has been filed with the Executive Officer of this Commission; and

WHEREAS, said proposal was made in the form of Resolution No. 1592 a resolution of application adopted by the Board of Directors of Sanitary District No. 6, and requesting the initiation of annexation proceedings pursuant to the District Reorganization Act of 1965, Division 1 (commencing with Section 56000) of Title 6 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, said resolution of application was accompanied by written consent signed by all owners of land within the territory proposed to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 56261, when a resolution of application is accompanied by written consent of all owners of land within the territory proposed to be annexed, this Commission may make determinations with respect to said application without notice and hearing,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER as follows:

1. Subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter specified, the proposal made by Resolution No. 1592 adopted by the Board of Directors of Sanitary District No. 6 is approved.

2. The boundaries of the territory proposed to be annexed shall be those set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein, and said territory shall be designated as "Redwood Boulevard Annexation (1976-11)", and is found to be uninhabited.

3. Any resolution ordering the annexation approved by this resolution shall provide that such annexation is ordered subject to the terms and conditions specified in the resolution of application.

4. Sanitary District No. 6 is designated as the conducting district for further proceedings; and the Board of Directors of said district is hereby directed to initiate proceedings in compliance with this resolution, and is authorized to proceed without notice or hearing pursuant to Government Code Section 56261.

5. The environmental documents relevant to the proposed annexation have been reviewed and considered by the Commission in making its final determination.


6. The Executive Officer is hereby authorized to mail certified copies of this resolution in the manner and as prescribed by law.



REDWOOD BOULEVARD ANNEXATION 1976-11

EXHIBIT "A"

Beginning at a point on the existing boundary of Sanitary District No. 6 of Marin County, said point being on the westerly line of Redwood Highway U.S. 101 Right-of-Way (as relocated in 1974) at its intersection with the centerline of Novato Creek, as said Right-of-Way line and Creek are shown upon the State of California "Right-of-Way Record Map" sheet R-21X.6; thence leaving said Creek Centerline and said Sanitary District boundary and running along said westerly Right-of-Way line South  $5^{\circ} 55' 45''$  East 532.55 feet to its intersection with the northeasterly line of the "Existing State Highway"; thence running along said northeasterly line North  $38^{\circ} 43' 19''$  West 827.28 feet to a point on said Sanitary District boundary and on said Creek Centerline; thence southeasterly along said Sanitary District boundary and along said Creek Centerline to the point of beginning.
