RESOLUTION NO. 66-13

RESOLUTION ORDERING THE "PETITION FOR FORMATION OF TAMALPAIS
COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT" TO A REORGANIZATION COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Marin County Local Agency Formation Commission has received a petition for the formation of the Tamalpais Community Services District as successor to the Tamalpais Valley Sanitary District; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has reviewed said petition in accordance with Section 56212 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, after proper notice the Commission has conducted a public hearing on the proposed petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the proposal of reorganization contained in the subject petition is referred to a reorganization committee; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the subject districts are: Tamalpais Valley Sanitary District, Almonte Sanitary District, Sausalito-Marín City Sanitary District, and Kay Park Sewer Maintenance District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the membership of the committee shall not exceed one representative from each subject district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the time and place of the first meeting of the reorganization committee shall be the Marin County Civic Center, Room 331 at 8:00 p.m., May 26, 1966.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the reorganization committee shall report its recommendations to the Commission at the regular Commission meeting, August 4, 1966.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the reorganization committee is instructed to study and report, in its final report, on the following considerations:

1. The need for inclusion of all ranch or rural areas in southern Tennessee Valley within the proposed district.
2. The possibility of extending the proposal to include other services and other areas: The Tamalpais Fire District may be considered for inclusion within this proposal and the basic petition may be expanded to include other services beyond the three which the petitioners have requested.
3. Working with the petitioners and with the County Public Works Department, the boundaries should be established as definite and certain.
4. The problem of the Kay Park Sewer Maintenance District should be analyzed as to how best to continue to provide sewer service to that district.
5. The inclusion of the small areas of the Almonte and Sausalito-Marín City Sanitary District should be analyzed.
6. The methods which will be used to provide sewer service in that area of the proposed district which does not now receive sewer service should be considered.
7. The question of tax equity within the district between areas receiving sewer service and those that do not must be reviewed.
8. The future of the employees of Tam Sanitary District must be specified.
9. An effective date for the new district must be set.

10. Study the relationship of Marin Municipal Water District's possible entry into sewage collection and treatment services in this general area of the County.


