RESOLUTION NO. 68-27

RESOLUTION APPROVING ANNEXATION OF TERRITORY
TO TAMALPAIS FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

RICHARDSON BAY ANNEXATION

WHEREAS, Tamalpais Fire Protection District of Marin County Resolution No. 27, a resolution of application to annex certain territory, has been filed with the Executive Officer; and

WHEREAS, at the time and in the form and manner provided by law, the Executive Officer has given notice of a public hearing by this Commission on said resolution; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing by this Commission was opened on the date and at the time specified in said notice of public hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin does hereby resolve, determine, and order as follows:

1. The application for annexation of that territory defined in Resolution No. 27 of the Tamalpais Fire Protection District is approved subject to the terms and conditions contained herein.

2. Territory proposed for annexation shall be designated as Richardson Bay Annexation, and is uninhabited.

3. The Tamalpais Fire Protection District shall be the conducting district for further proceedings to annex this territory and the Board of Directors of that district is directed to initiate annexation proceedings in compliance with this resolution, and if any election is ordered, it shall be held only in the territory to be annexed.

4. The resolution of the conducting district ordering such annexation shall provide that the annexation shall be subject to the same terms and conditions as are contained herein.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Marin County Local Agency Formation Commission on this 20th day of November, 1968, by the following vote:



RICHARDSON BAY ANNEX
TO
TAMALPAIS FIRE DISTRICT

Beginning at a point on the Tamalpais Fire District Boundary line, said point being the intersection of the centerline of Coyote Canal with the centerline of Saucelito Canal; thence Southeasterly to a Northerly corner of lot 281 as shown on Map No. 1, Salt Marsh and Tidelands Survey of 1870; thence running Easterly along the Northerly boundary line of said Tidelands Survey to its intersection with the Westerly right-of-way of Rosedale Canal; thence Southwesterly along said Westerly right-of-way to its intersection with the Southwesterly right-of-way of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad; thence Northwesterly along said Southwesterly right-of-way to a point on the existing Tamalpais Fire District boundary line; thence continuing Northwesterly along said Southwesterly right-of-way to the centerline of Coyote Canal; thence along said centerline to the point of beginning.
