

LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION OF THE COUNTY OF MARIN

RESOLUTION NO. 70-45

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FORMATION OF A COUNTY SERVICE
AREA FOR POLICE SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Marin County Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 70-330 applying for formation of a County Service Area for Police Services was filed with the Executive Officer of this Commission; and

WHEREAS, at the times and in the form and manner provided by law, the Executive Officer has given notice of a public hearing by this Commission upon said resolution of application; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was held by this Commission at the time and place stated in the notice.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin does hereby resolve, determine and order as follows:

1. The application of the Marin County Board of Supervisors as stated in Resolution No. 70-330 is approved.
2. The boundaries of the territory proposed for the County Service Area as set forth in the resolution of application are approved.
3. Said territory is found to be inhabited.
4. This approval is made with the recommendation that the Board of Supervisors investigate all inequities involved in the formation of this County Service Area.

COUNTY SERVICE AREA NO. 12

Beginning in the Pacific Ocean at the southwestern corner of Sonoma County; thence southeasterly along the southern line of Sonoma County, to the mouth of Petaluma River; thence southeasterly to the common corner of Marin, Sonoma, Contra Costa, and Solano Counties in San Pablo Bay; thence southerly along the western boundary of Contra Costa County in the Bay of San Pablo, to the middle of the Straits of San Pablo; thence southerly in a direct line to Invincible Rock, in the Bay of San Francisco, near the entrance of the Straits of San Pablo; thence, in a direct line to the northwestern point of Red Rock; thence southerly to the extreme southerly point of Angel Island; thence southwesterly to the extreme end of Point Cavallo at the low-water mark; thence on the line of low-water mark along the northern shore of the bay to Point Bonita, and three miles into the Pacific Ocean, to the northwestern corner of San Francisco County; thence northwesterly by ocean shore to the place of beginning.

Excepting and excluding therefrom the following incorporated areas as their boundaries exist as of October 1, 1970:
