

RESOLUTION NO. 68-14

A RESOLUTION OF THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION OF THE COUNTY OF MARIN DISAPPROVING THE PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT OF SANITARY DISTRICT NO. 2 AS A SUBSIDIARY DISTRICT TO THE TOWN OF CORTE MADERA.

WHEREAS, a mandatory resolution of the Town of Corte Madera proposing the establishment of Sanitary District No. 2 of Marin County as a subsidiary district of the Town of Corte Madera was heretofore filed with the Executive Officer of the Local Agency Formation Commission, and said Executive Officer has examined said resolution and found it to be mandatory; and

WHEREAS, at the times and in the forms and manner provided by law said Executive Officer has given notice of public hearing upon said resolution; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing by this Commission was held upon the date and at the time and place specified in the notice of public hearing, and in any order or orders continuing such hearing; and

WHEREAS, at such hearings this Commission heard and received evidence which was presented or filed, and all persons were given an opportunity to hear and be heard in respect to any matter relating to said resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin does hereby determine, resolve, and order as follows:

1. The resolution of the Town of Corte Madera proposing establishment of Sanitary District No. 2 as a subsidiary district to the Town, is denied without prejudice.

2. The Commission looks to Sanitary District No. 2 to submit a report to the Commission within 90 days of this date, said study to evaluate the possibility of consolidating Sanitary District No. 2 with Sanitary District No. 1 of Marin County.


3. The Executive Officer is hereby authorized and directed to mail certified copies of this resolution in the manner as provided in Section 56272 of the Government Code.

RESOLUTION NO. 960

A RESOLUTION OF APPLICATION BY THE TOWN OF CORTE MADERA REQUESTING THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION TO TAKE PRELIMINARY PROCEEDINGS FOR EITHER THE MERGER OF SANITARY DISTRICT NO. 2 OF MARIN COUNTY WITH THE TOWN OF CORTE MADERA OR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SAID SANITARY DISTRICT AS A SUBSIDIARY DISTRICT OF SAID TOWN

RESOLVED, by the Council of the Town of Corte Madera, California, that

WHEREAS, the Council of said Town desires to initiate preliminary proceedings pursuant to the District Reorganization Act of 1965, Title 6, Division 1 of the Government Code of the State of California, comprising Sections 56000 through 56550 of said Code, for either the merger of Sanitary District No. 2 of Marin County, a public corporation, with the Town of Corte Madera, a municipal corporation, or the establishment of said Sanitary District as a subsidiary district of said Town;

WHEREAS, the proposed merger or establishment of a subsidiary district will affect the City of Larkspur, Sanitary District No. 1 of Marin County and the County of Marin, State of California;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED, as follows:

1. That this resolution of application be, and it is hereby, adopted and approved by the Council of the Town of Corte Madera and the Local Agency Formation Commission of Marin County be, and it is hereby, requested to undertake preliminary proceedings for either the merger of Sanitary District No. 2 of Marin County with the Town of Corte Madera or the establishment of said Sanitary District as a subsidiary district of said Town, in the manner provided by the District Reorganization Act of 1965.

2. That the Territory within the Sanitary District proposed to be merged with or made a subsidiary district of the Town of Corte Madera is inhabited.

3. That the reasons for this proposed change of organization are as follows:

a. To reduce the overlapping of governmental agencies serving essentially the same people.

b. To improve the responsiveness of local government to the people it serves.

c. To unify the authority for related local government services.

d. To improve coordination of planning for public improvements.

e. To improve administrative efficiency.

4. That the Local Agency Formation Commission is hereby requested to undertake preliminary proceedings for either the merger of Sanitary District No. 2 of Marin County with the Town of Corte Madera or the establishment of said Sanitary District as a subsidiary district of said Town.

5. That the Clerk of the Town of Corte Madera be, and she is hereby, authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the executive officer of the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of Marin, State of California.
